Village Water Quality Report Available Online

The Village of Coal Valley water Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), also known as a safe drinking water or water quality report, is an annual report that summarizes the quality of drinking water Coal Valley's community public water systems.

The purpose is to raise customers' awareness of where their drinking water comes from, the quality of their drinking water, what it takes to deliver water to their home and the importance of protecting drinking water sources.

Coal Valley has two separate systems. A majority of the village is served by the report called 2021 CCR – Water Report. The remainder of the Village of Coal Valley located in Henry County near the golf course is served by a report called

Street Sweeping Begins in June

The Village of Coal Valley is planning street sweeping on June 1st and June 2nd. The goal is to sweep residential streets at least two times per year with a second sweeping being planned in on November 2nd and November 3rd.

Street sweeping is the most effective way to keep storm drains free from the build-up of dangerous contaminants that can enter sewer systems, catch basins and local bodies of water. In addition, street sweeping helps keep neighborhoods clean.

From brake shoe dust, oils, and other contaminants produced by vehicular traffic, regularly scheduled street sweeping reduces street maintenance and moisture trapped on the road, preventing cracks and deterioration, and reducing infrastructure costs.

In last month's newsletter, I got my Coal Valley grocery stores mixed up and thankfully, I received a nice letter from Ed Willhouse, the son of the owner of Don's Royal Blue. The store I was wishing to write about was the predecessor of Cooper's Grocery Store on the corner of U.S. 6 and 1st Street. Next week I wish to write about the downtown Coal Valley businesses such as Don's Royal Blue.

He writes "For clarification, Mom and Dad's Royal Blue store was located in the original Coal Valley area off US150 across the street from the current post office and on the current site of Dave Lindberg's storage units."

Mr. Willhouse continues stating "As I recall, dad purchase the business around 1948 (year I was born) and sold the business in 1961. Dad's store was previously owned by the Getch (spelling may not be correct) family and was an IGA store at the time dad purchased the business. He received his start in the grocery business while work for the Norton brothers at the IGA store in Orion. He moved from IGA affiliation to Royal Blue in the mid 1950s. Coopers

store opened some time after dad's purchase his store."

Niabi Zoo Begins 2022 Season

Niabi Zoo opened to the public on Monday, April 18. “We are very excited to be able to welcome guests back to the Zoo!” said Director, Lee Jackson. “Moving into the 2022 season, we have a lot of new things in the works. It is going to be an exciting summer!”

Guests will notice a number of changes this season. These include far fewer Covid related restrictions. Guest are no longer required to wear mask in most areas including rides. “We also no longer have restrictions on the number of people we can allow into the park. Hours of operation will also return to the pre-Covid schedule, with the zoo being open from 10 -5pm (last entry at 4).”

Niabi will continue its use of online ticket sale, but you will also be able to purchase your tickets at the gate. There will be a discount available for those purchasing their tickets online. As with many businesses around the country, we have found it challenging to fill all of our staff positions this season. Some services may be limited for a few weeks. Please visit our website for a complete list of visitor guidelines, and note that mask will still be required , or visitation limited in several areas.

The most exciting news however involves the animals. Several big projects are going to be underway this year, including work on a new prairie dog exhibit and a new exhibit for African painted dogs.

New additions to the zoo. Nyura and Antin, Amur leopards that were born earlier this year will make their debut later this spring, along with several other new youngsters that will be announced in coming weeks.

Water Survey to Analyze Flood Risks in RICo

Illinois State Water Survey (ISWS) hydrologic and hydraulic modeling in Rock Island County is underway as part of a study to help local communities identify areas of high flood risk for flood mitigation planning.

ISWS is working collaboratively on the project with American Surveying & Engineering, P.C. and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

The first phase of the project, data collection, began in late April 2022 and will be completed in early summer 2022. In this phase, surveyors will conduct detailed channel and bridge surveys of the river, including in or near the cities of East Moline (unnamed ponding areas located in the northern

portion of the city), Moline (Coal Creek), Rock Island (Eckhart and Kyte creeks), and the Villages of Coal Valley (Coal Creek, Coal Creek Tributary, and Shaffer Creek) and Milan (Eckhart and Kyte creeks), as well as the Unincorporated Areas of Rock Island County (Coal and Shaffer creeks).

Residents should be aware of the periodic presence of survey crews in the area. Surveys will be completed as stream conditions and weather allow.
