1. Call to Order. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Bartels.

2. Roll Call/Establishment of a Quorum

4. Reading and Approval of Minutes.

Trustee Stickell made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2021 Board meeting and the minutes of the September 1, 2021 Executive Session. A second to the motion was given by Trustee Rigg. Roll Call: Ayes-Argo, Mountain, Engstrom, Stickell, Hoyt, Rigg. Ayes 6, motion carried.

5. Public Presentation/ Recognition and/or Public Comments.

Mayor Bartels asked if there was anyone from the public that would like to speak tonight.

Kendall Morley of 112 E 3rd Street asked about solicitors and being registered with the Village to solicit. Church organizations have been going door to door and have been a disturbance. The Village Board stated that Churches are exempt from registering to solicit. Clerk Hulliger mentioned to Mr. Morley that she has a "no solicitors" sticker on her door and that has seemed to work well.

Joel Meister of 506 E 8th Avenue addressed the Board on the "no parking" Ordinance that is being discussed for E 8th Avenue. Mr. Meister explained his main concern is for the safety of the kids. Mr. Meister asked if any studies have been done in the area. Chief Whitney set up radar on E 8th Avenue and had no issues. Chief Whitney was asked if the electronic speed signs have read outs that can be downloaded. The Chief responded they do not. Discussion was held.

6. Reports from the President and Other Officers (on matters not otherwise appearing on the agenda).

A. President-Mayor Bartels informed the Board of a new Re-build Illinois Main Street Grant for \$250,000.00. The Village should apply for this grant and use it at the Post Office Park for a new pavilion, veteran memorial and other needed items. The Mayor talked with an architect in East Moline from the Streamline Architectural firm. It would cost between \$2,000.00 and \$3,000.00 to have them draw up a design for the Post Office Park.
